Library at Polgollawatte School

Library at the Polgollawatte was another project funded by the Pahansila-Davis Educational Project. As the first stage over 340 books were donated to the school. A book cabinet, a paper stand, and a notice board were also provided as well as several educational posters. The library was declared open by an assistant director of education of the central province. Pahansila financial administrator Mr. Nandasena Perera and project supervisor Ms. Ruwangani Jayasundara also were present.

Vocational and technical training program

A new project was launched to provide vocational and technical training to the students who attended Math and English classes under Pahansila-Davis Educational Project. As the first stage, we selected 16 students. These were students who had completed G.C.E. (O/L) exams. This project was targeted to provide a career opportunity to these students. The courses are offered by National Youth Council, Polgolla (Kandy) under the Ministry of Youth Affairs. The courses include a variety of fields such as computer related studies, surveying, motor mechanism, beauty culture, bakery & hotelier, landscaping, refrigeration, electrical, and electronic studies.

Selected student are allowed to follow a program of their choice. Course fees range from Rs.3000 to Rs.14,000 and the period of training varies from 3 months to one year. Some of these are diplomas and all those who successfully complete courses will receive recognized certificates. Part of the course fee is paid at the beginning and only after a successful assessment of the student halfway through the course, the balance of the fee is paid. The Principal of Polgollawatte Vidyalaya, Mr. Nishantha Tennakoon supervises the project.

Singithi Sevana English classes

A Pahansila General Coordinating Committee representative visited Singithi Sevana Children's home in January 2008 to assess the progress of the English class conducted under the Pahansila-Davis Educational Project. He met several students and the English teacher, Mrs Vasanthi Meegahawatte. He also met the financial administrator of the project, Prof. Viru Gunawardane. The classes were conducted very satisfactorily and the progress was evident.

Rageesh Chaturanga, a former Pahansila recipient, completed the O/L examination extremely well in 2004



obtaining A passes for all ten subjects. Rageesh was one of the very first students helped by the Pahansila. The project was started in 2003 by the Urbana-Champaign chapter. The scholarship was sponsored by the common pool funds and was supervised by Ms. Ruwangani Jayasundara.

The success of Rageesh is a very good example that 'with determination one can overcome any obstacle in life'. His father faced a tragic death during the 1989 riots and the family cultivation suffered. Despite these problems, Rageesh did well in his studies and got through the 5th standard scholarship exam and entered the Ranabima Royal College, Gannoruwa, Peradeniya, a prestigious government school in the Central Province. Unfortunately, tragedy struck Rageesh's young life again. His mother was diagnosed with cancer and she died soon after. Rageesh was left an orphan with only his aunt to care for him. He received the Pahansila scholarship until he started receiving the pensions of his late parents. Despite the many tragic incidents in his young life Rageesh continued to do extremely well in studies which resulted in his outstanding success at the 2004 O/L examination.

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
